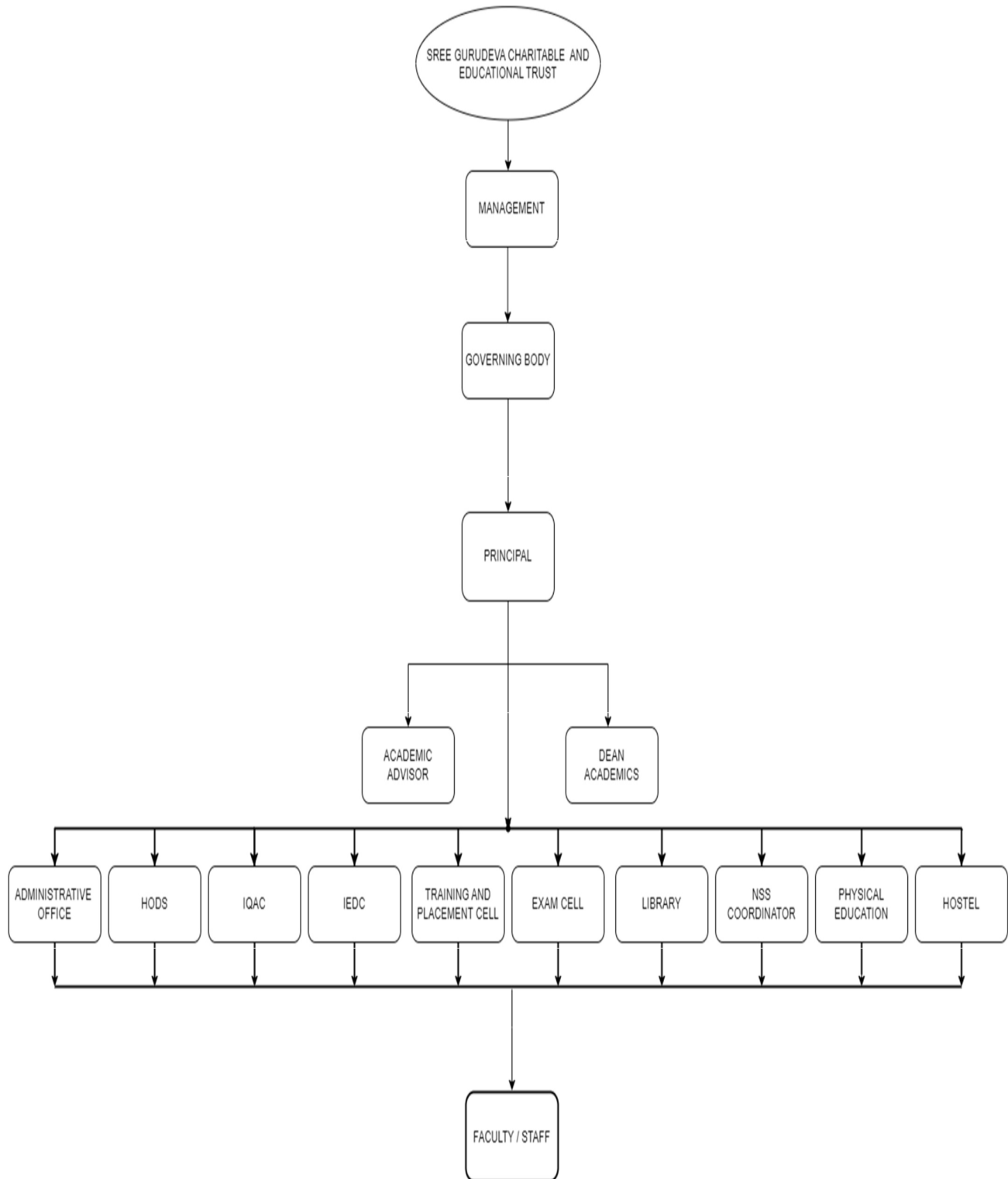

KeamScholarship: Tuition Fee Waiver scholarship is granted to BP Land other economically weaker students admitted in Government quota.

For M.Tech Scholarship amount of ₹26,000 per semester is granted for all students admitted for M.Tech in our college. Additional scholarship of ₹ 10,000 will be granted for alumnus.

Scholarship is available for candidates with valid GATE score as per AICTE norms for the total period of 24 months subject to the conditions mentioned in the prospectus issued by DTE. SC/ST Students will be eligible for stipend as per Kerala State Government Rules. Minority scholarship is granted to students of minority communities

11. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

There is an admission committee, consisting of Principal, Academic Dean, Faculty members. The procedure of admission is controlled by the admission committee. During the time of notification from the university, advertisement will be given by college in the newspaper and website. Applications are invited from candidates to Management and NRI Quota. The requirements are scrutinized by the admission committee; the documents of the admitted students are verified and finally approved by the management. Finally the documents are filed by the admission supervisor committee. The admission to the merit seats are conducted strictly adhering to the regulations given by the Commissioner for entrance examination.

Calendar for admission against Management/vacant seats:

The calendar is published by the management and admission committee during the time of admission.

12. Criteria and weigtages of admission

The criteria for getting admission in Management and NRI Quota is that the student should score at least 45% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Maths. For Management seat admission the student also should qualify the entrance examination (KEAM or JEE). For NRI seat admission the student should have at least 45%marks in Physics, Chemistry and Maths. Also for NRI

admission a sponsorship letter and VISA copy of the sponsor should be submitted along with the documents.

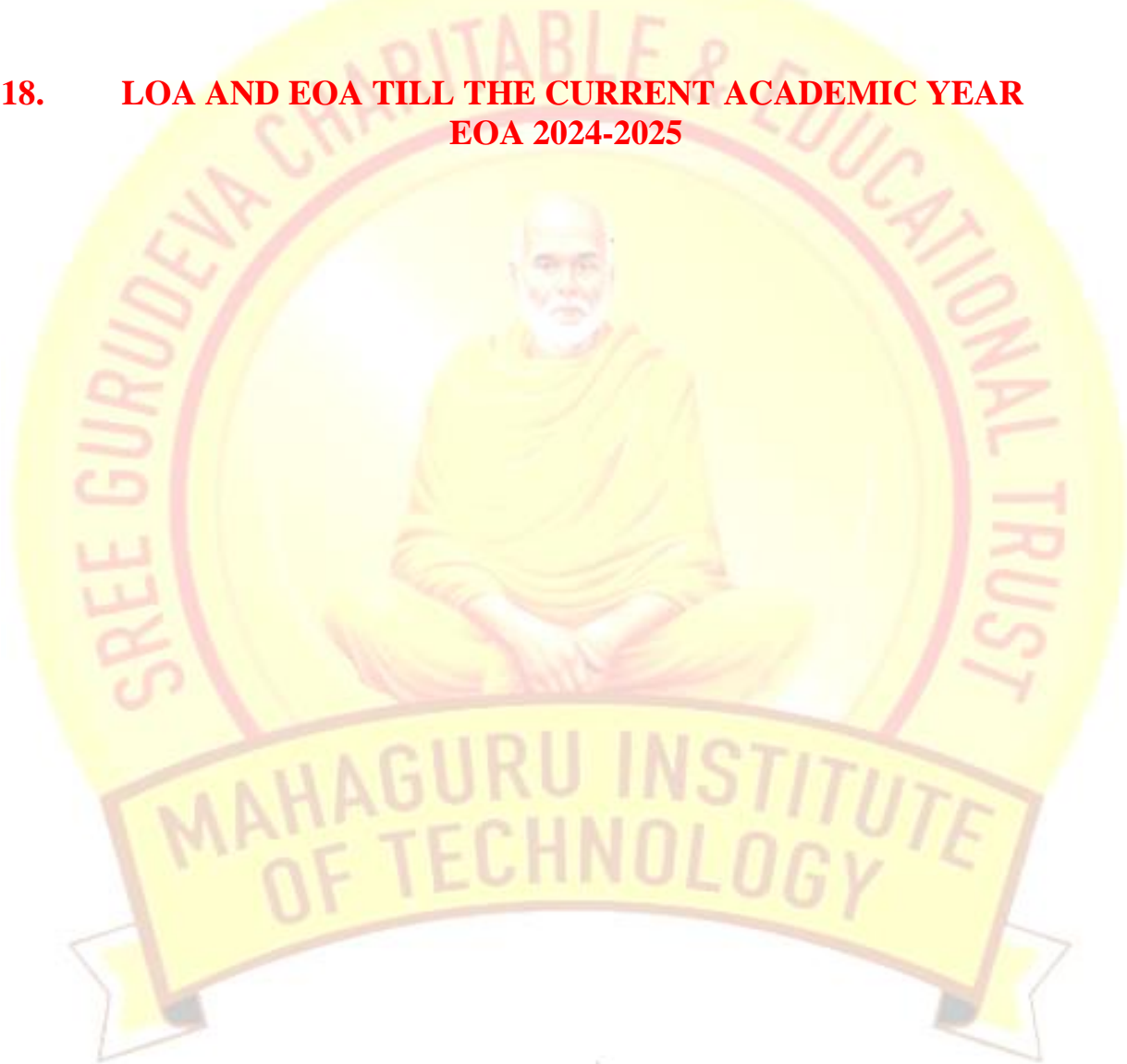

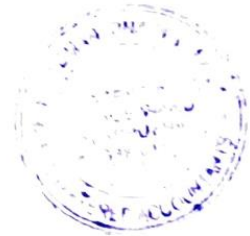

16. BEST PRACTICE ADOPTED

Best Practice-1: Student Counseling

Objectives

The objective of the counseling cell is to encourage the students to understand themselves and identify the problems they face in their daily lives, which include personal, family-related, educational, social, and psychological issues that can be resolved by giving proper guidance, which helps to build self-confidence in them can be resolved by giving proper guidance, which helps to build self-confidence in them.

The Context

- Helping the students with academic difficulties such as slowness in understanding, poor academic and non-academic performance, concentration issues, etc.
- Ensures a confidential atmosphere in which the student can discuss any concerns they may have.
- Assist the students to identify their inner strengths and weaknesses, which enables their holistic development.
- Not only has that, the brilliant students been also to be guided to take part in various inter-collegiate and inter-university competitions.
- Students with broken families are being counseled to build positive relationships, attitudes, and behaviors

The Practice

The student counseling cell is headed by Dr. Dhanasree M. B., who has more than five years of experience in psychological counseling and a Homoeopathic Physician for ten years. A counseling session is organized once a week. The counseling sessions include supporting the emotional and professional growth of students, developing and monitoring counseling support programs, and providing educational and vocational guidance. Counselor can handle 5 to 10 students individually in a day, and a group of 60 to 70 students can be motivated by organizing student-friendly activities such as role play, singing, dancing, playing musical instruments, puzzle play, word games, and quizzes. Such activities will help to promote joy and happiness among students and also help to develop interpersonal relationships between them. Those students who overreact to insignificant problems or get worried with anxiety, fear, and tension are counseled and helped to feel comfortable and calm. Health counseling is also included in this program

Evidence of Success

Students who underwent such counseling sessions were found to be relaxed and gained insight into their thoughts, feelings, and behaviors, leading to a greater understanding of themselves. They learn how to communicate more effectively with others, leading to better relationships. Also, help them identify and address problems in their lives, leading to better decision-making. These changes reflect on their academic performances too

Resources

The programme does not require much financial commitment. A skilled doctor is handling the students and gives support to them to make the better person of tomorrow. All the activities are being recorded for further evaluation of students.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required

- **Matching Mentors and Mentees:** Difficulty in finding suitable matches between mentors and mentees based on interests, personalities, and goals.
- **Mentor Availability:** Mentors may have busy schedules, making it challenging to dedicate sufficient time and attention to their mentees.
- **Communication Barriers:** Lack of effective communication between mentors and mentees can hinder the mentoring relationship and limit its impact.
- **Goal Alignment:** Misalignment between the goals of mentors and mentees may lead to frustration and disengagement.
- **Accountability:** Difficulty in holding mentors and mentees accountable for their commitments and responsibilities.
- **Mentor Training and Support:** Inadequate training and support for mentors may result in ineffective mentoring relationships.
- **Evaluation and Feedback:** Difficulty in assessing the effectiveness of the mentoring program and collecting feedback for continuous improvement.
- **Qualified Counsellors:** Trained professionals who can provide individual, group, or family counselling to students.
- **Counselling Office Space:** A designated area where counselling sessions can be held, ensuring privacy and confidentiality.
- **Confidentiality Protocols:** Procedures and policies to ensure that student information remains confidential unless there's a risk of harm to the student or others.
- **Assessment Tools:** Instruments for evaluating students' academic abilities, interests, personality traits, and mental health status.
- **Referral Networks:** Connections with external mental health professionals, healthcare providers, or specialists for cases that require specialized assistance beyond the scope of the counselling centre.
- **Library of Materials:** Books, articles, and other resources related to personal development, mental, health, academic success, and career exploration.

- Collaboration with Faculty and Staff: Partnerships with educators, administrators, and other campus personnel to identify students in need of support and facilitate interventions.
- Parental Involvement Programs: Initiatives to engage parents or guardians in the counselling process, particularly for younger students or those facing significant challenges.
- Training Programs: Ongoing professional development opportunities for counsellor to enhance their skills and stay updated on best practices in student counselling.
- Feedback Mechanisms: Surveys, focus groups, or other methods for gathering feedback from students to assess the effectiveness of counselling services and identify areas for improvement. .

Aim of the practice:

- To counsel students and to interact with them for doubt clearance and problem solving
- To improve teacher-student relationship
- To guide students to choose right career paths for job, higher studies, entrepreneurship, etc
- To train students for improving their behavior and quality of life in the society.

The Context

- Immature students take own decisions.
- Mentorship programme of Mahaguru institute of technology guides and counsels the students in academic, nonacademic and personal matters to achieve their best in life
- The programme aims at addressing deficiencies of students in their attitudes, habits, and knowledge on learning process.

The Practice

- A group of 20 students is usually placed under a mentor.
- Mentor has direct communication with the group 235
- Mentors meet the students on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 4:10 pm to 5:00 pm
- Parents/Guardians of poor attendee/performance students are called to meet the mentors
- Corrective and preventive actions are implemented for further improvement.
- Mentors take initiative to arrange remedial and tutorial classes for slow learners.
- Each mentor maintains a record which is examined by the HOD, the class teacher and counsellors. Mentors take active initiative to arrange student feedback.
- Mentors discuss issues relating to good and bad study habits, study planning and techniques, health, personal relations, examination preparation etc.
- Mahaguru institute of technology regularly arranges mentorship awareness/training programs for newly recruited faculty members. The faculty finds these very useful.
- Academic Journal
- Personality and character documentation

Evidence of Success

- Improved attendance after counseling by mentors.
- Improved teacher-student relationship.
- Better academic performance.
- Enhanced participation in extra-curricular activities.
- More disciplined and stress free students
- Ragging-free campus.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required

- The newly joined faculty members are not accustomed with the mentorship programme.
- Additional orientation course on mentorship to the new faculty
- Lack of sufficient time for one-to-one student interaction.
- Appreciation of mentors through the annual faculty appraisal.
- Financial requirements to organize workshops by hiring experts on mentorship, organizational behavior and stress management on regular basis.
